1. Introduction

- 1.1 In April 2021 Scottish Government increased funding to support implementation of the Carers (Scotland) Act 2016. This means that there is £222, 451 for the year 2021/22 available in Dumfries and Galloway to support Carers.
- 1.2 This paper provides
 - an overview of Scottish Government Carers (Scotland) Act funding and how this is allocated locally
 - an update on progress to date in making best use of the 2021/22 funding

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 The Clinical and Care Governance Committee is asked to:
 - Note the overview of the use of Scottish Government Carers (Scotland)
 Act 2016 funding
 - Note the progress to date to make use of the 2021/22 funding

3. 2021/22 Carers Act Funding

- 3.1 As outlined in the Supporting Carers paper to IJB on 27 May 2021 (see background papers) there is £222,451 plus £8,000 from 2020/21 to be allocated to support unpaid Carers in their caring role during 2021/22.
- The available Carers Act Funding for 2021/22 was considered by the Carers Programme Board (CPB) at their meeting on 4 May 2021. Members agreed that, in partnership with Carers themselves and Carer support organisations, a process be developed that ensures an effective, inclusive and equitable approach is taken to considering the use of this funding.
- This process was developed and agreed by the Carers Programme Board. A copy of the process is attached in **Appendix 2**.
- 3.4 Recognising the need to move at pace to support Carers the CPB invited proposals to provide immediate support to Carers in the short term. They also identified that some of the funding be used on a non-recurring basis to test change in order to ensure best value, take the opportunity to be innovative and achieve the maximum positive impact for Carers. Recurring funding proposals would also be considered and would require IJB approval.
- 3.5 The Carers Programme decided to initially promote two rounds of applications, the first from July September to allow for proposals which are at an advanced stage and a second from late October January for other proposals.
- 3.6 Eight proposals for Carers Act Funding were received in the first round of the process. Two proposals were not scored as they did not meet the criteria to support Carers and two organisations were advised that their proposals required further development before being considered. It is expected that these proposals will be resubmitted during the second round which is currently underway.
- 3.7. Four proposals were approved by the Carers Programme Board at their meeting on 2 September 2021:

- 3.8. The applicants have been advised of the funding and arrangements are being made to ensure full and robust evaluation of the outcomes that will be reported to the Carers Programme Board.
- 3.9. A second round of the process is currently underway. The timetable for this second round of funding is as follows.

4. Conclusions

- 4.1 Additional Carers Act Funding has been made available to further support Carers in Dumfries and Galloway.
- 4.2 Following a process developed by the Carers Programme Board to ensure best and most equitable use of these funds four non-recurring funding proposals have been approved for 2021/22 at a total of £157,476.

4.3 A further round of applications will be considered by the Carers Programme Board in December 2021 and further updates will be provided to the IJB.

5. Resource Implications

- 5.1 The report sets out the Carers Act Funding since 2018/19 and highlights the unallocated funding of £222,451 plus £8,000 from 2020/21 available in 2021/22 to support Carers.
- 5.2 The process for the allocation of the remaining funding has been developed by the Carers Programme Board. The first round of funding applications has been completed with the second round currently underway.

6. Impact on Integration Joint Board Outcomes, Priorities and Policy

- 6.1 The subject links to the national Health and Wellbeing Outcomes for Carers which states: 'People who provide unpaid care are supported to look after their own health and well-being, including reducing any negative impact of their caring role on their own well-being'.
- 6.2 It also links to the current IJB Health and Social Care Strategic Plan which states:
 - We will provide support to Carers (including providing short breaks) so that they can continue to care, if they so wish, in better health and have a life alongside caring.
 - We will develop a consistent approach across the workforce to make sure that the needs of the Carer are identified and that Carers are supported in their own right.
 - We will work towards developing 'Carer Positive' as an approach across the Partnership; identifying staff that are Carers and supporting them in their own personal caring roles.
- 6.3 It also links to the draft Strategic Commissioning Intention SCI8:

'People who deliver health and social care, including Carers and volunteers, are valued and fully supported to maintain their wellbeing and developed to achieve their potential.'

7. Legal and Risk Implications

- 7.1 Unpaid Carers in Scotland represent a larger workforce than the paid health and social care support workforces combined. Supporting Carers to maintain their caring role is widely acknowledged as vital for the long term sustainability of health and social care services.
- 7.2 There would be the potential for legal issues if the elements contained within the Carers Act were not delivered.
