1. Introduction

1.1 This Report is brought before you today to provide you with an update on the interim governance arrangements which have been in place following agreement at the Integration Joint Board of the 22nd April 2020.

2. Recommendations

2.1 The Integration Joint Board is asked to:

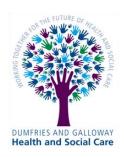
Approve:

- The ongoing enactment of delegation of authority to the Chief Officer of the IJB in consultation with the Chair and Vice Chair of the IJB
- To continue the suspension of the IJB Performance and Finance Committee for a period of 6 months when this decision will be reviewed
- That any decisions that would be taken to the IJB Performance and Finance Committee for agreement/discussion will be brought to the IJB
- The reinstatement of the IJB Audit and Risk Committee, IJB Clinical and Care Governance Committee, Strategic Planning Group, Integration Partnership Forum and where appropriate any Workshops sessions
- A timescale for virtual meetings going forward

3. Background and Main Report

- 3.1 At the IJB meeting of the 22nd April 2020 Members agreed to issue delegated authority to the Chief Officer to take action on such matters that could not wait for a decision by the Integration Joint Board. This enactment is carried out in line with Section 15 of Standing Orders of Dumfries and Galloway Integration Joint Board, which states that in exercising this delegated authority, the Chief Officer will consult with the Chief Executives of both NHS Dumfries and Galloway and Dumfries and Galloway Council and thereafter to the Chair and Vice Chair of the Integration Joint Board. Such matters will then be reported to the next meeting of the Integration Joint Board.
- To date the delegated authority to the Chief Officer has not been required; however, it is important that this remains in place during this current time.
- 3.3 At the meeting it was agreed that all other meetings of the IJB such as Committees, Strategic Planning Group, Integration Partnership Forum and workshops should not be held to allow Officers to focus on the regionwide response to the Coronavirus Pandemic in its infancy.
- Now that services within both the NHS and Council are returning to a more normal way of working it is natural that decisions require to be made, processes continue and governance, including meetings, return to a new normal way of working. Work is ongoing to provide a new Strategic Plan, and 2021 will see a review of the Integration Scheme therefore it is important that meetings are reinstated to allow these processes to continue.
- The IJB will continue to receive progress on performance and finance therefore at this time, to reinstate the IJB Performance and Finance Committee may be seen as a duplication, hence the reason why this Committee will not be reinstated at this time. A further decision on the future of the Committee will be made at the end of the financial year.
