1. Introduction

1.1 The issuing of Directions to either or both NHS Dumfries and Galloway or Dumfries and Galloway Council by the IJB is a legally binding process which provides the IJB with the means by which to deliver its Strategic Commissioning Plan.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 The Integration Joint Board is asked to:
 - Approve the set of Annual Directions (Appendix 1) to be issued to the constituent authorities

3. Background and Main Report

- 3.1 Under the Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014 integration authorities were provided with the mechanism in which to issue legally binding directions to either or both constituent authorities of NHS Dumfries and Galloway and Dumfries and Galloway Council. This is to enable the IJB to action its Strategic Commissioning Plan and to carry out each function delegated to it by the constituent authorities.
- 3.2 Following discussions earlier this year between the Chief Officer, Chair, Vice Chair and IJB Governance Officer, it was agreed to begin the process of issuing a set of annual Directions at the start of this financial year which would link with the 9 National Health and Wellbeing Outcomes for Health and Social Care, the priority areas of focus as outlined in the current Strategic Commissioning Plan and the current tactical priorities of the Health and Social Care Partnership.
- 3.3 From these conversations, and following several iterations, 11 directions have been developed which once approved will be added to the correct template and forwarded to NHS Dumfries and Galloway and Dumfries and Galloway Council in order that they can then direct the Health and Social Care Partnership to implement these Directions.
- 3.4 All Directions will be reviewed on a 6 monthly basis via the IJB Committee structure.
