## 1. Introduction

- 1.1 As part of the [2019 Partnership Delivery Framework](#) (appendix 2), Alcohol and Drugs Partnerships (ADPs) are required to report to the Scottish Government on specific alcohol and drug progress made against national outcomes. The ADP Annual Reporting Survey response from all 30 ADPs in Scotland helps to inform a better understanding of service delivery and the local challenges faced by ADPs. The survey requires feedback on areas which are not already reported on nationally via other reports and submissions and therefore does not reflect the totality of the work carried out by ADPs.
- 1.2 The purpose of the Annual Reporting Survey is to gather data at a national level to inform alcohol and drug policy monitoring and evaluation. The areas highlighted at a national level relate to:
- The monitoring of the National Mission;
  - The work of National groups including: Whole Family Approach group; Public Health Surveillance group and the Residential Rehabilitation group; and
  - The priority areas of work for National organisations such as Police Scotland which support whole system delivery approach

## 2. Recommendations

## 3. Background and Main Report

- 3.1 The survey is designed to collect information from ADPs on a range of activities relating to the delivery of the National Mission; [National Mission: An outcomes focussed approach - National Drugs Mission Plan: 2022-2026](#) (appendix 3).
- 3.2 The Reporting Survey 2022/23 is connected to the aspirations of the National Mission, therefore focuses on providing information relating to the ADP's activities and engagement in the following priorities:
- Death Review Process
  - Staff Resources
  - Lived and Living Experience
  - Stigma Reduction
  - Prevention and Early Intervention
  - Harm Reduction – including people most at risk
  - Justice
  - Quality Treatment and Recovery Services
  - Addressing Multiple Disadvantages
  - Children and Families
- 3.3 The data collected across all ADPs will be analysed and published at an aggregate level as official statistics. All data is shared with Public Health Scotland to inform

	alcohol and drug policy monitoring and evaluation. At a local level, however, the expectation is to publish the Dumfries and Galloway return and use the information gathered to inform challenges and opportunities highlighting priority areas for future work.
<b>4.</b>	<b>Conclusions</b>
4.1	The IJB is responsible for issuing directions to the ADP and has responsibility to ensure that ADP funding is used in accordance with national priorities for alcohol and drugs in prevention, treatment and recovery.
4.2	The ADP aims to ensure that these priorities and those that may be identified from the Annual Reporting Survey are progressed.
<b>5.</b>	<b>Resource Implications</b>
5.1	There are no resource implications resulting from this survey. The ADP has clear policies and procedures for aligning resources for investment with strategic planning using the Standing Financial Instructions and the scheme of delegation. The finance and performance group, established in May 2022, has oversight of funding and spend plans and makes recommendations to the ADP.
