#### 1. Introduction

- 1.1 Following discussion at the Integration Joint Board (IJB) on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2022, a direction was issued for NHS Dumfries and Galloway (NHS D&G) to undertake an independently chaired local service review of maternity services in the Wigtownshire locality; this was inclusive of an options appraisal.
- 1.2 This paper is to inform of the discussion from the IJB Transformation and Futures/Innovation Committee on 10<sup>th</sup> August 2023 where it was agreed that options 1 and 2 would be recommended to the full IJB to be subject to formal consultation.

#### 2. Recommendations

The Integration Joint Board is asked to:

- Note the completed report Independently Chaired Local Service Review of Maternity Services Provision in Wigtownshire Locality.
- Consider the recommendations of the IJB Transformation and Futures/Innovation Committee on 10<sup>th</sup> August 2023 where it was agreed that options 1 and 2 would be recommended to the full IJB to be subject to formal consultation.
- Provide direction to NHS D&G Board to undertake formal consultation on the two options
- Note the consultation timeline and accompanying data pack

#### 3. Background and Main Report

- 3.1 A review of maternity services commenced in January 2023 following direction from the IJB meeting on 8<sup>th</sup> December. This was following the temporary suspension of low risk, intrapartum maternity services at the Galloway Community Hospital in 2018 due to staffing pressures.
- 3.2 The IJB Transformation and Futures/Innovation Committee on 10<sup>th</sup> August 2023 were asked to consider the content of the report, the recommendation and associated conclusion. Thereafter approving the recommendation for consultation on options 1 and 2.
- 3.3 The Independent Chairs and Professional Midwifery Expert stood down following the presentation of the engagement report at the IJB Transformation and Futures/Innovation Committee on 10<sup>th</sup> August 2023. The local review team thanked them for all their contribution on behalf of the Board.
- 3.4 A formal consultation period is planned for October 2023 to December 2023. During this period there will be:
  - Public consultation events
  - Consultation with community councils and elected members
  - Consultation with key stakeholders
  - Further online survey
  - Communications plan

#### 4. Conclusions

- 4.1 It is recognised that a robust communication plan will be required to ensure concise and clear messaging around expectations and interpretations during the consultation period and moving forward. The consultation period will include multiple methods for communicating; this will include an online survey, the use of social media, paid for press/radio adverts and scenario planning videos.
- 4.2 The IJB are asked to be cognisant of the need to direct NHS D&G to deliver a sustainable and deliverable model.

#### 5. Resource Implications

- 5.1 This review has to date been funded by the WCSH directorate.
- 5.2 The resource implications are yet to be fully recognised, however a financial framework with provisional costings for options will be developed following the direction for consultation being received by NHS D&G Board.

#### 6. Impact on Integration Joint Board Outcomes, Priorities and Policy

- 6.1 The proposals in this paper will support delivery of the following National Health and Wellbeing Outcomes:
  - People who use health and social care services have positive experiences of those services, and have their dignity respected.
