<p>1. Introduction</p> <p>1.1. Completion of the Alcohol and Drug Partnerships (ADP) Annual Reporting Survey is a requirement by all ADPs across Scotland. It relates specifically to a range of aspects set out by the National Mission on drugs, to report on progress in these areas.</p>

<p>3. Background and Main Report</p> <p>3.1. The Annual Reporting Survey relates to the following Health and Wellbeing Outcomes</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Outcome 4: Health and social care services are centred on helping to maintain or improve the quality of life of people who use those services.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Outcome 5: Health and social care services contribute to reducing health inequalities</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Outcome 7: People who use health and social care services are safe from harm.</p> <p>3.2. This paper has not previously been discussed at the IJB or one of its committees</p> <p>3.3. The National Mission was launched to reduce drug-related deaths/harms and improve lives impacted by drugs. A wide range of initiatives falls under the umbrella of the National Mission including</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fast access to treatment and support services • Increased capacity in the use of residential rehabilitation • Standards to improve Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) • Including people with lived/living experience and family members in decision making and service provision • Supporting children and families affected by problematic drug use • Emergency life-saving interventions- naloxone, assertive outreach, safer consumption <p>3.4. The ADP three-year strategy and delivery plan 2023-2026 is currently into its final year with a wide range of actions already completed to address the areas highlighted in the National Mission.</p> <p>3.5. The Annual Reporting Survey data provides information on progress of the National Mission at a local level and supports the work of the national organisations which support local delivery.</p>
<p>4. Conclusions</p> <p>4.1. The ADP Annual Reporting Survey shows the wide range of work already underway, which supports the National Mission and also the national and local alcohol and drugs strategies.</p> <p>4.2. There has been increased engagement with people in recovery and also those with Lived/living experience and family members to ensure their voices are heard and</p>

	can be involved in service planning, delivery and decision making.								
4.3.	The implementation of the MAT Standards and the key work around experiential data collection is contributing to the improvement in quicker access to services and service quality.
