1.	Introduction
1.1	This report provides a strategic-level overview of the current Directions issued to Dumfries and Galloway Council (DGC), NHS Dumfries and Galloway, or both parties.
1.2	At present, there are 23 active Directions (Appendix 1). This update focuses on the status and progress of those currently in effect.
1.3	There are 8 Directions identified for closure. These will undergo the appropriate evaluation process via the Finance, Performance and Quality Committee, ensuring that each Direction meets the necessary criteria for formal closure.
1.4	Additionally, a new Direction has recently been issued. Progress on this Direction will be reported through the Finance, Performance and Quality Committee

3.	Background and Main Report
3.1	Directions are legally binding, which is why they come at the end point of a process of planning and decision making. The delivery partners are required to comply with all directions received from the IJB, and the law is clear that they may not amend, ignore, appeal or veto any direction.
3.2	Due to Directions being legally binding we must have a robust process around the governance of Directions that have been issued to constituent parties and also ensure alignment to the delivery committees of the constituent parties.
